Match Day

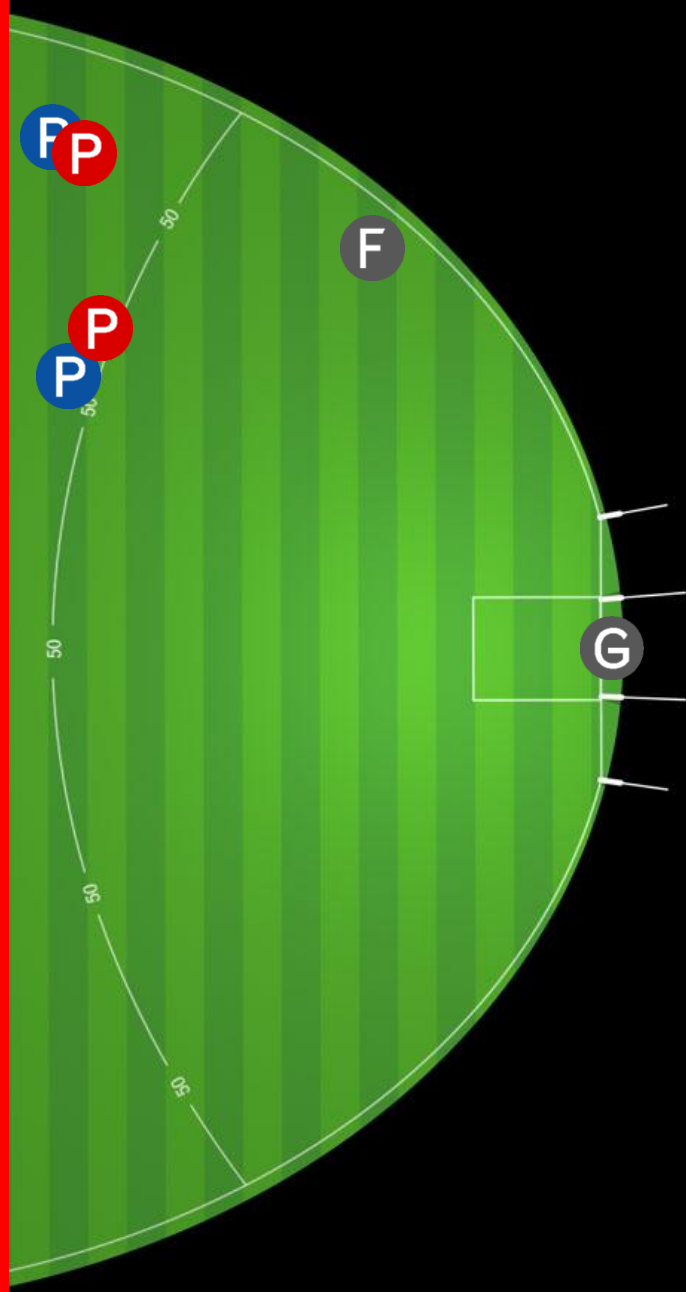
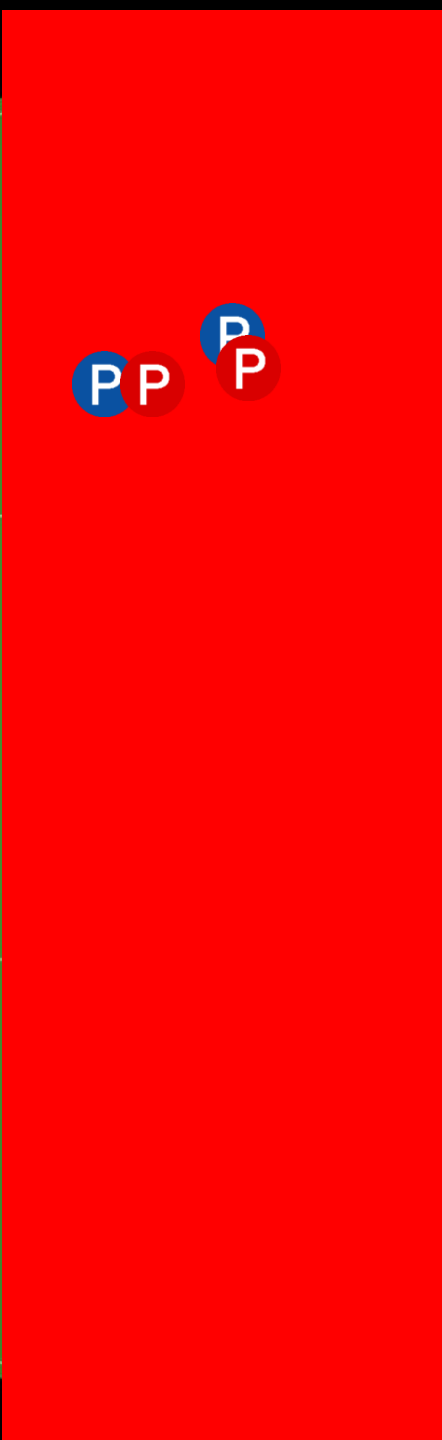
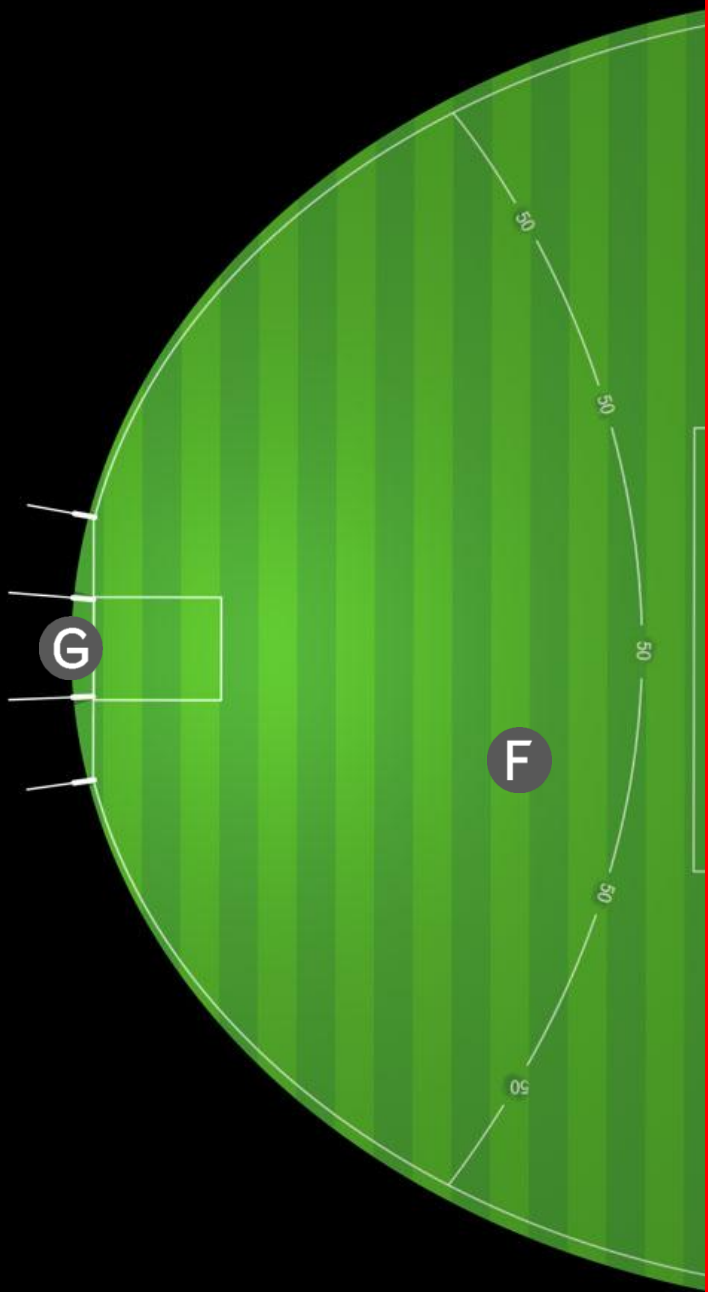
- 1 Witness a reportable offence.**
- 2 Notify the players involved as soon as possible after the incident.**
- 3 Make notes at time of incident.**
- 4 Fill in report form clearly and correctly.**
- 5 Notify Stan Pokorny on the night that you made a report. (03) 5243 2627.**



MATCH DAY

- 1 Refine your notes at home including a diagram of where incident occurred & where you were in relation to the incident.
- 2 Before tribunal hearing have your notes clearly typed up on the computer.
- 3 Prepare answers to common questions that may be asked for example.

Common Questions

1. Where was play at the time of the incident?
2. Where was the ball at the time of the incident?
3. Where were you when the incident occurred?
4. How far away from the incident were you?
5. Was a free kick or 50m penalty awarded?
6. How did other players react after the incident?
7. What did the offended player say when notified of the report?



Rule 19

Reporting Players & Officials

READ YOUR RULE BOOK



Obligation to report

19.1.1 **To Controlling Body** - an umpire shall report to the controlling body any player or official who commits or engages in conduct which may constitute a reportable offence:-

(a) during a match or

(b) on the day of the match and within immediate proximity of the arena (500 metres) where the match was conducted

Obligation to report

DID YOU KNOW?

The GFUL Coaching Panel has been authorised to report any player or official who commits or engages in conduct which may constitute a reportable offence.



Rule 19.3

Reporting Procedure

READ YOUR RULE BOOK



Reports During a Match

- (i) at the time of the incident
- (ii) before the commencement of the next quarter
- (iii) where the incident occurs in the final quarter, after the completion of the match.



DID YOU KNOW?

An umpire may inform the captain, acting captain or official of a team of a report where it is impractical to inform the player or official who has been reported.



DID YOU KNOW?

Apart from informing a player or official of the report an umpire shall not speak with the reported player or official or any other player or official about the report which had been made.
